




PAINTS USED IN THIS GUIDE

Kimera: Golden Brown VMC: English Uniform AK: Sand Yellow Liquitex Heavy Body: White








So this gold recipe was a bit tricky to nail down as I wanted to try a bunch of things and ended up scrapping them mostly due to difficulties getting the coverage I wanted.

But, for the sake of the guide, the basecoat was a very dark Ochre. Easily mixable using VMC English Uniform + Black. The first light was then painted using Kimera Golden Brown as you can see in the picture. These highlights generally followed the work already done on the armor, which is very important to do for consistency in your non metallics. If you paint an highlight in a certain position while working on a NMM, the trims of that detail will reflect the light roughly in the exact way, since they're part of the same volume.

FIRST STEPS



By adding AK Sand Yellow to the Kimera Golden Brown, I worked up the highlights, focusing them on the edges and trying to keep these lights as small as possible.

HIGHLIGHTS



Lastly, by using pure white, I painted the strongest lights, such as the top of the shoulder or the neck armor.


Naturally, during these steps I also worked on creating gradients by mixing the colors used on the layers and placing them to bridge the tones.
