WHY THIS MODEL?



I choose this model because it's likely one of the best releases ever made by GW. I love the character from the Lore and I think they did him justice with the model.

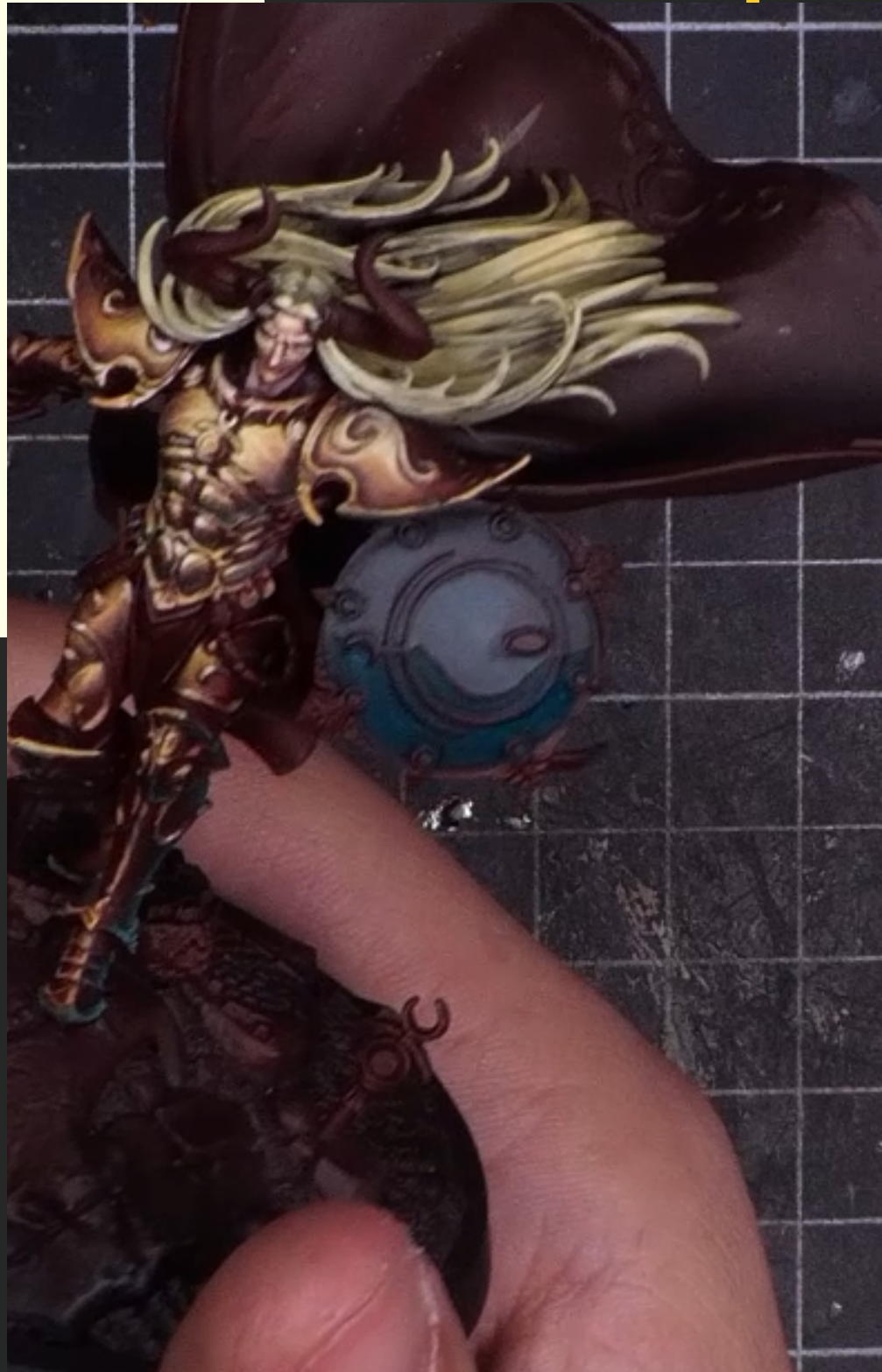
PAINTS USED IN THIS GUIDE

AK: Ice Yellow, Ivory

Vallejo Model Color: Black, Prussian Blue

Kimera: Green

SHIELD PT. 1



The shield was split into two halves to create the idea of a simple, yet strong, reflection on it.

The upper half was painted with a grey mix coming from a mix of VMC Black and AK Ice Yellow, the bottom half with a mix of Kimera Green and VMC Black. I then painted a thin black line separating the two halves to create an "horizon line".



SHIELD PT.2

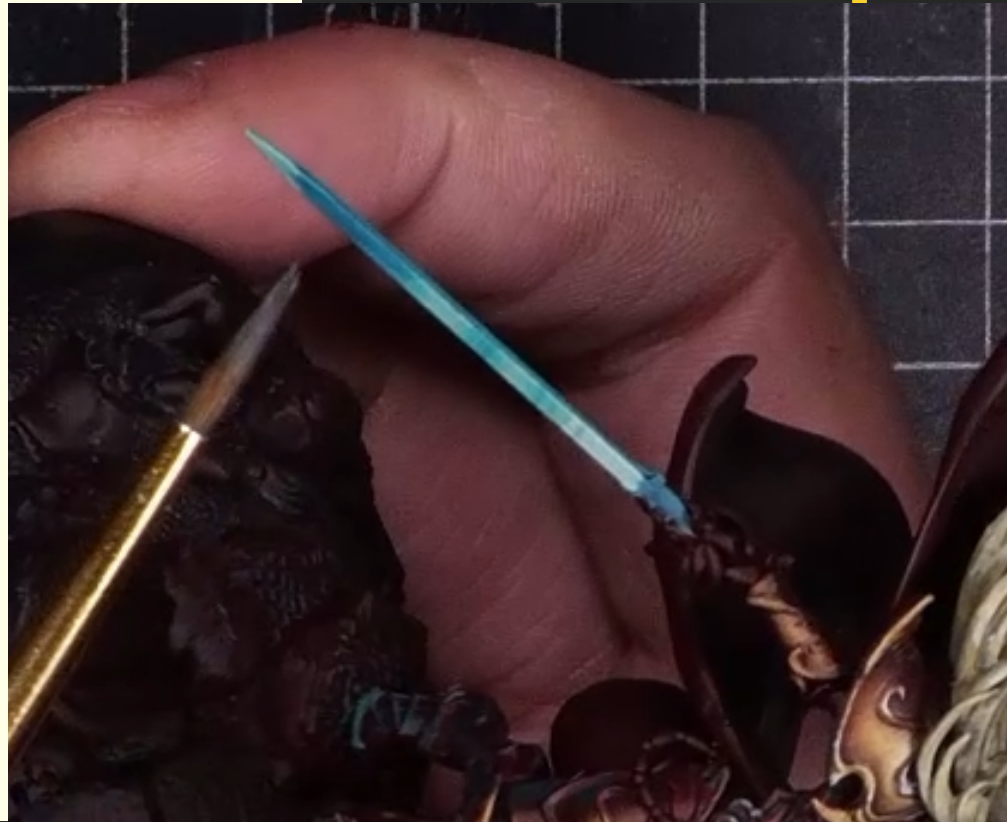
It didn't like the shape of the line between the two halves, so I made it horizontal.

The upper half was highlighted adding more and more ice yellow to it, focusing the lights in the center of the shield but also creating small lines of light in the outer rim.

The bottom half was made considerably darker adding more black to the basecoat and then progressively highlighted through Kimera Green and, later, adding AK Ice Yellow to it.

Lastly, I glazed a little bit of VMC Prussian Blue to the outer top part of the shield, to give a subtle sky color to it.

SWORD



The blade was basecoated with a Kimera Green + AK Ivory mix.

I then used a darker version of this color (added black) to glaze in the shadows and a brighter version of it (added Ivory) to sketch in the highlights.

I didn't need to blend the highlights too much as I wanted them to be a bit more "illustrative", therefore I painted them as diagonal volumes and progressively made them brighter by adding Ivory to it.

Lastly, I painted the edges of the blade in Ivory.
