THE GEORGE AND DRAGON INN

The George and Dragon is a coaching inn based on a real inn of the same name. Coaching inns were used as waypoints for people traveling by stagecoach, providing food, drinks, rooms and animal feed for those passing through.


The real George and Dragon is located in Southwark, London and is currently known as The George Inn. Originally built in the 1600s, the inn was believed to host Shakespearean plays in the courtyard. Today, the establishment still serves food and drinks. Sadly, stagecoaches are no longer available.




A version of the inn with a small stage in the courtyard is included. Guests of the inn would probably watch these plays from the upper-floor gallery.

Parties looking to hire a stagecoach might make their way here to find one. While most parties will have horses of their own, a stagecoach might be useful for those needing to transport substantial amounts of cargo. Should this cargo happen to be valuable, the stagecoach driver may disappear with it.

Coaching inns were commonly frequented by mail coaches, which would have teams of horses stabled at inns along their route. This allowed them to change their tired horses for fresh ones, speeding up the pace at which they could travel.
