

I usually try to put down drawings as quickly as I can, but it's also good practice to lean into pieces that have a good level of detail. 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Lettering is another thing skill that I would really like to improve, and so I've started doing these lettering studies. I feel bad, I wish I had done a more thorough job cataloguing these references - I really don't deserve any credit for any of these pieces. They're all directly referenced. But they are really good practice and I'm really glad I've been doing them! WINNERS.

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
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















Another major thorn in my side... environments! The only way out is through. All of the studies you see on the following pages were done from reference photos















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This is concept art from Oban Star Racer





















Even these simple perspective exercises of interiors can be really helpful practice!














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Above is a colour and value comp study from a frame of Back to the Future. I want to do more of these!




Early Christian Byzantine

These were the initial concepts that I submitted for a horror short story that was ultimately completed for Cloudscape's Bones of the Coast anthology.

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


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


I also spent a lot of time outside! Most of the sketches in the pages that follow are from life or memory (unless noted) I believe these were from photo reference though.






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
Couple of Sauls in there (from Better Call Saul)
