Notes: The original recording is in the key of B major, making it tricky, many people have moved it up a semitone to C major making it much more Ukulele friendly, but if you want to play along with the record you need B major.

Intro Riff

NOTES: N.C. means no chord, this is the part where you kick off the song. The slides happen on the off beat of the 4, so 1 & 2 & 3 & 4 &, the & after 4 is where you want to slide in to the double stop, the real kicker if jamming with someone else is to try to hit the double stop on the chord over the 1st beat, because the double stop you are going into are two chord notes and it sounds so nice with two Ukuleles.

Stum Pattern

The strum pattern is a
1 e & a 2 e & a 3 e & a 4 e & a
x x D U x x D U x x D U x x D U

Don't let the sixteenthths intimidate you! Just keep your hand in constant motion and squeeze to voice on the off beat, remember, mutes on the one! See video for additional help of strum pattern.
