# Audio Edit Notes

## Title and Intro Notes

"Sonscreen" just a quick and easy pun for the title this week. The intro, I was surprised to learn, was remarkably challenging to sing because Little Richard did the original! A liberal dose of Melodyne on my vocals to pitch correct this.

Originally, the intro song was darker (the group was split as to whether it was funnier or not).
