2022 BY THE NUMBERS

- 8 more traditional sets this year (excluding Double Feature, 40K, Starter decks, 30th Ed.) which is on par for the last few years. 2021 had 7. 2020 had 8.
- Feels like more because of all the Commander-specific products.

30TH ANNIVERSARY COUNTDOWN KIT

Not to be confused with the 30th Anniversary BETA Reprint product! This was the advent calendar thing. Wildly popular, but the ordering process was a disaster. Left many buyers without the product and others with a duplicate copy or even copies.

IS THERE TOO MUCH NEW PRODUCT?

I feel like we say this every year now, so let's just go ahead and say it. There's too much new product.

• Has your relationship with product releases changed? What should players do to keep from burning out?

THERE IS TOO MUCH NEW PRODUCT

- They aren't going to make less product. So the question becomes: How do we react to it?
- Commander is a social-based, eternal format. Our players don't have to keep up with everything. *Is there an upside to "too much product?"*

Jimmy - I feel like I over estimated Displacer Kitten as well as Archivist of Oghma / Deep Gnome Terramancer. It could be that my expectations were just too high.

JLK - I got everything right! Lol - I dunno, I can't think of anything off the top of my head. I disagree with Jimmy, I still think Displacer Kitten and Deep Gnome Terramancer are nutso. Archivist is good but not insane but I feel that's what I thought about it originally. I don't remember you really gushing about it either Jimmy. Maybe I'm wrong.
