Mannish Boy Muddy Waters

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This song is in 12/8, which would've made the licks quite a bit trickier to read if the timing had been timed out. As such your gonna have to try to groove along to the recording with this one. Remember that the x will be in the kick drum in the recording, this is a great way to improve your feel and timing and should be practiced routinely.

Principal riff, this would harmonize best over an A7 chord in an A blues, but also works as its own rhythm. Note the root note in bold gets played repeatedly and is the highlight of the riff.
